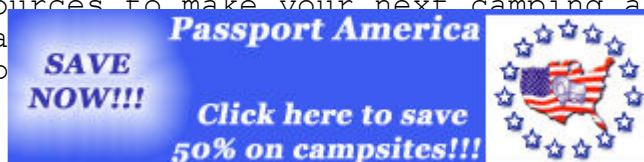

101 Top Camping Tips For Beginners

1. Gather all your camping equipment in a corner of a room and keep adding to it as you think of it.
2. Use basket shelves in your car for easy storage.
3. Store your clothes in sports bags.
4. Make sure all heavy items are secure and are packed at the bottom of your car boot with lighter items on top.
5. Take one prepared meal in a freezer meal that can be easily reheated on arrival at your destination.
6. Make sure you have everything you need for a drink stop like tea bags, instant coffee, sugar, condensed milk, cordial, powder, biscuits, a two litre bottle of water, matches, kettle, wet wipes and tea cloth
7. If you are going away for a short trip prepare your hot dishes so that you have more time to relax at your camp site and enjoy yourself.
8. Stock up on fresh fruit and vegetables at every chance.
9. List everything you will eat on the number of days you are away.
10. Keep extras always on hand which includes flowers for cakes and breads, noodles, rice, beans and lentils.
11. Remember long life milk (two to three cartons of long life milk per day should be sufficient for a family of two children and two adults as a guide).
12. Try camping in your backyard to see how you feel about your tent and sleeping bags etc.
13. Your first camping gear does not have to be expensive. It is more important that it is durable and keeps you protected from all weather conditions. Bring a piece of ground cloth with you, a piece of plastic that goes under your tent. Tuck the edges neatly underneath the tent. The first thing you must consider when choosing the tent is the size ie the number of people your tent is going to house.
14. Take cutlery with you that is old and definitely won't be missed if it doesn't come home with you.
15. Keep cutlery separate from crockery by placing them in plastic containers with lids or in a tea towel in a plastic bag.
16. Here is a list of items of cutlery and crockery that may be useful for your next camping trip. A fork, knife, teaspoon and dessert spoon should be enough for each

person.

17. Have a serrated edge knife that can also be used as a bread knife.

18. Vegetable peeler and knife.

19. Metal egg lifter.

20. A large aluminium coffee pot, the larger the better.

21. Barbeque tongs.

22. Egg rings.

23. A small meat mallet.

24. A sharp knife and sharpener.

25. Can opener.

26. Large serving spoon and wooden spoon.

27. Make sure you have an enamel cup, bowl and plate for every person.

28. Use an enamel plate next to the fire to warm food.

29. Use an enamel plate as a base for food in your camp oven.

30. Bring paper plates in case you are in an area where water is scarce, and be sure to take your rubbish with you.

31. Avoid glass containers and bring plastic drink containers are more practical

32. A first aid is a must have for every camping trip, but especially when you are camping the first time. Always take a good first aid book with you.

33. Fit your vehicle with a CB or UHF radio.

34. Keep bug repellents away from all plastics as they actually will dissolve some plastic items.

35. Always carry a fuel stove with you in case firewood is difficult to find.

36. To make meal preparation easier in the evenings take a gas or fuel lantern with you.

37. Buy a cheap door mat available for a couple of dollars at some hardware stores to put at the front of your tent to stop dirt coming into the tent.

38. Always make sure your camp equipment is working before

you bring it with you and make sure there are no fuel or gas leaks.

39. Bring your camera with you.

40. Always have layers of clothes with you because the weather can change five times a day easily when camping.

41. Always wear clothing that dries quickly.

42. Always wear a hat and plenty of sunscreen.

43. Let your sleeping bag keep you warm. Wear light clothing to bed as added layers will take away from your sleeping bags ability to keep you warm at night.

44. When you try on hiking boots make sure you take hiking socks with you. You must break in your boots very, very well prior to your trip or your feet will make you very, very sorry. A good way to break in your boots is to wear them 1-2 hours a day for a week.

45. Only take a lightweight sleeping bag with you if you are travelling in tropical locations.

46. Practice sleeping in the backyard or just on the floor in your home for at least one night so that you have adequate time to make changes or adapt your bedding to bedding suit you and your family's needs.

47. If you can't decide on the perfect tent hire one before you buy.

48. Always buy camping equipment that has a reasonable guarantee.

49. All tents should be insect and waterproof.

50. Make sure you always have extra ropes, tent pegs and poles.

51. Take a heavy duty hammer for hammering tent pegs into the ground as they are much more effective than a mallet.

52. Leave bulky jumpers and jeans at home. Instead bring high quality skivvies and tracksuits as they are more lightweight and quicker to dry.

53. Try to allow only one sports bag for each person's clothes.

54. Wear old sandals or sneakers when swimming.

55. Sew velcro tabs to the hems of your trouser pants so those areas can be sealed off from bugs.

56. Keep your tent zipped up at all times to avoid any

nasty bugs getting in.

57. Pack up all your food and scraps at night so that you don't attract any uninvited guests.

58. Always check before you put shoes on in case spiders have made a home in there.

59. Deter leeches by rubbing your legs in insect repellent or tea-tree oil.

60. Think about what would happen to your site in the event of a storm.

61. Consider the location of bathroom facilities when choosing a campsite.

62. Avoid camping where trees are leaning over tent pad sites.

63. Pine trees act like lightning rods when lightning strikes so avoid camping near them.

64. Make sure your site has good drainage.

65. Protect food by storing it in your car. Your car boot is the best location.

66. Place all foodstuffs in double plastic bags and place them away from the campsite on low ground.

67. Do not place food packs in trees.

68. Tightly seal your food so that there are no smells and move it away from your campsite.

69. Put away in a separate container about a week's supply of the following food stuffs: tinned and packed food, oats, vegemite, jam and other spreads, tea, coffee, sugar, dried fruits, nuts and seeds, rice, dried complete dinners, packets of soup, baked beans and spaghetti.

70. Always use a good reliable map.

71. If you become lost stay with your vehicle and wait for another to pass by.

72. Do not separate to look for help.

73. A second tent is a great play room for the kids.

74. Find a nice safe spot near water where the kids can play.

75. Use moist baby wipes or wet ones for washing hands.

76. Always wear gloves when collecting firewood.

77. Cut an orange in half and eat the pulp. Then crack an egg into the orange skin and place it in the embers until the egg turns white.

78. Build your fire on a bed of sand or dirt away from logs or stumps and vegetation.

79. Pack binoculars.

80. Place items at easy reach that you will have to use first when you arrive at your camping ground.

81. Avoid traditional bear feeding areas.

82. Avoid camp locations where bears have been known to roam in the past.

83. Avoid camping where you may have trouble seeing a bear through vegetation.

84. Avoid camping where you see bear droppings and fresh tracks.

85. Never feed wild bears.

86. Store your food in a cooler which is locked in the car

87. Like most animals, bears are attracted to garbage so make sure your campsite is very clean

88. Remember that behind every cute baby bear is a very overprotective bear mother!

89. Stop fishing when bears are present. They want your fish more than you do.

90. Give children an easy map to navigate to with interesting sign posts etc.

91. Take turns for children to sit in the front seat with time limits.

92. Invent games as you go along.

93. Make up a list of items that they should spot along the way.

94. Provide a rubbish bag for each child.

95. Restrict toys to only one per child.

96. Place logs alongside your tent's perimeter to create a water diversion.

97. Pack your pots, pans, dishes and utensils in heavy

duty plastic containers with secure latches. These heavy duty boxes will serve as a great work surface table, a non perishable food box safe from animals and recycling and rubbish containers.

98. Sanitize working surfaces with a new spray bottle filled with 1 part bleach and 20 parts water.

99. Use a meat thermometer to determine that your meats are cooked adequately. 165F for chicken and turkey, 155F for ground beef and pork and 145F for fish and pork.

100. Practice with a friend's camp oven before you go out and buy one for yourself.

101. Building a below level fire will be safer for you in windy conditions.
